Sunday Readings

1st Reading : Sir 3:17-20. 28-29. There is praise for the person who is humble.

2nd Reading: Heb. 12:18-19. 22-24. This contrasts Mount Sinai, which stands for the heavenly Jerusalem.

Gospel: Luke: 14:1. 7-14. Jesus urges his followers not to covet places of honour, and always to act out of unselfish motives.

Papal Mass - Thursday 16th September 2010 - Bellahouston Park, Glasgow.

We hope soon to have more detailed information to give to Pilgrims.

Passes will be issued on the buses **on the day of the Pilgrimage & not before the event.**

If you have put your name down but you find that you are unable to attend please let the Pilgrim Leader (**Honor**) know as soon as possible to allow the place to be re-allocated to someone else. Each person, even infants, requires a **Pilgrim Pass**.

If you are permanently confined to a wheelchair & therefore need to travel by an adapted bus, please let the Pilgrim Leader (**Honor**) know as soon as possible.

People who use folding wheelchairs should bring their own chairs.

Provision will be made for those who use sign language.

Anyone under 18 allocated a Pass, must be accompanied by an adult.

The Mass will start at **5.15pm** and will conclude at **7.30pm**.

All pilgrims will need to be in the park by **3.00pm**.

When Mass is finished it will take some time to empty the park and it will be dark. It will be chilly and may be wet. There will be no shelter from the elements.

Seating will **not** be provided. PLEASE pray for nice weather!

Travel arrangements are being organised centrally and because of security arrangements, parishes and individuals will **not** be able to use their own transport.

Payment for Pilgrimage: After each Mass on Sat 4th/Sun 5th & Sat 11th/Sun 12th payment will be collected in the Oratory. If you are able to pay by cheque, please do so. Cheques should be made payable to "Our Lady of Good Aid". If any individuals or families have difficulty in meeting these costs don't hesitate to contact Canon Carey.

Bellahouston Mass: 2 further rehearsals for musicians and members of Parish congregations have been arranged for Tuesday 31st August and Tuesday 7th September at 7.30pm in The Cathedral, please, let's have a good attendance.

Magnificat Prayer Book: To enable us to participate in the Visit, as prayerfully and as fully as possible, whether we are present at one of the venues where the Holy Father will be or whether we participate at home through the television, radio or internet, a special Prayer Book for the Visit has been produced. This Prayer Book contains the texts for the liturgies, together with articles to explain the context and background to the other parts of the Visit. The Prayer Books are free, however, a suggested donation of £2 for each copy would go a long way to help defray the costs being borne by the Church. We hope that you will find this special Prayer Book a valuable resource for the Visit of Pope Benedict. Please pray that the Visit of the Holy Father will renew the hope and strengthen the faith of the people of the United Kingdom.
